OVER THE EDGE: FORMING ASIAN CANADIAN STUDIES

Inaugural Meeting of Asian Canadian Studies Network

June 1-2, 2013, University of Victoria

As part of the inaugural meeting of the Asian Canadian Studies Network, the organizers are planning a panel to showcase research by graduate students that promises to shape the future of this emerging field. We welcome proposals from students currently enrolled in Masters and Doctoral programs, and whose research address Asian Canadian history, culture, and social relations (applications from recent graduates will also be considered). The panel will take place in the afternoon of June 1, 2013 as part of a two-day event on Asian Canadian Studies that will be held in conjunction with Congress 2013 in Victoria.

Selected applicants will be asked to offer a condensed presentation of their research, as well as participate in discussions regarding the formation of the ACS network. Subject to funding availability, we hope to provide selected applicants with two nights accommodations in Victoria (June 1 and 2), a per diem allowance, a travel allowance (for those coming from outside the Greater Victoria area), and a ticket to the community banquet on June 2.

To apply, please send a current CV and a description of research project (no more than three pages). Applicants will be selected on the basis of how their projects speak to the emergence and unfolding of the field, as well as disciplinary and regional concerns.
